Nurses Hold Picket at MPP Will Bouma's Office, Calling for Better Primary Care Funding

BRANTFORD, ON, January 15, 2025 – Dozens of nurse practitioners (NPs) and registered nurses (RNs) – members of the Ontario Nurses' Association (ONA) – from Grand River Community Health Centre rallied outside Member of Provincial Parliament (MPP) Will Bouma's office today. The RNs and NPs are demanding the Ford government increase primary care funding to promote retention and close the wage gap so that more of their community members can access the primary care they need.

"More than two million Ontarians desperately need primary care, including thousands of residents in the County of Brant," says ONA Provincial President Erin Ariss, RN. "NPs and RNs are already providing high-quality primary care. They can help fill the primary care gap, but the Ford Conservatives are deliberately underfunding the sector so that their corporate buddies can turn a profit at the expense of taxpayers."

NPs are highly skilled, autonomous practitioners who can diagnose and treat patients, prescribe medications, provide referrals and order tests, and more. The significant lack of primary care funding is impacting the retention and recruitment of these nurses in community care. Ford's underfunding keeps community care staff wages low, even with the dramatic rise in the cost of living. This forces many NPs and RNs out of their jobs in community health centres and into hospitals, where wages are higher.

Ariss says, "MPP Bouma and the Ford government must start 2025 with new and sustained funding specifically earmarked for existing primary care teams and nurses' and health-care professionals' wages to promote retention. With fair and equal wages that recognize the skill and expertise of NPs and RNs in community health centres, this government can demonstrate that it cares about our communities, and people can access the timely care they need and deserve."

ONA is the union representing 68,000 registered nurses and health-care professionals, as well as 18,000 nursing students, providing care in hospitals, long-term care facilities, public health, the community, clinics and industry.

Ontario Nurses' Association expresses grave concerns amidst contract talks with hospital CEOs

TORONTO, ON, January 17, 2025 – Five days of talks between the Ontario Nurses' Association (ONA) and the Ontario Hospital Association (OHA) have yet to result in a negotiated new contract for the province's 60,000+ hospital-sector nurses and health-care professionals.

"ONA entered into these talks determined to negotiate a new contract," says ONA Provincial President Erin Ariss, RN. "The last time a deal was negotiated was a full 14 years ago. Unfortunately, what the OHA has tabled would have unimaginable consequences for the nursing and health-care professional workforce and devastating outcomes for patients."

The top bargaining priority for ONA's front-line members is the implementation of registered nurse (RN) staffing ratios. Staffing ratios make timely, quality care easier to access for patients, and help keep nurses and health-care professionals from leaving their jobs in severely understaffed hospitals that take a heavy toll on them and the care they are able to provide.

"Hospital CEOs and the Ford government have been intentionally understaffing our public hospitals to justify selling off public services to private, for-profit clinics," Ariss notes. "Staffing ratios are the real solution to the crisis in our hospitals, not for-profit health care."

Ariss adds that for too long, nurses and health-care professionals have been expected to stay silent and work under increasingly impossible conditions. "Hospital CEOs are pushing for changes that would decimate the health workforce, and their proposal has the fingerprints of the Ford government all over it.

"We are no longer staying silent. We are fighting back. Hospital CEOs and this government are on notice: if they pursue this agenda, they had better be prepared for the fight of their lives," she says.

The two sides head to mediation on January 29 and 30. ONA members will be holding a series of escalating actions in the coming weeks.
