MÉLANIE JOLY (Minister of Foreign Affairs of Canada):	We believe that our arguments are strong. I think that I've had numerous conversations where the reaction was actually very positive. But meanwhile, there's still a lot of work. This administration in the U.S. is very unpredictable. So, we have to be ready and working on both fronts.
- <u>CARTER:</u>	The Foreign Affairs Minister, Mélanie Joly, says she will head back to Washington this week to meet with the Secretary of State, Marco Rubio and also Trump's border tsar. Joly comments come as the Wall Street Journal reports that people around Trump are urging him "Do not back down on the threat of tariffs!", even if he does receive concessions from Canada and Mexico. Our political correspondent, Glen McGregor, tracking the ongoing talks and says the central issues continue to shift.
- <u>GLEN</u> <u>MCGREGOR</u> <u>(Journalist):</u>	Of course, Canada has taken steps to appease some of Donald Trump's major concerns about security of the border, about the flow of illegal migrants from Canada into the United States, as well as the flow of illegal drugs. But the conversation keeps shifting and now Trump's primary fixation on this seems to be with the balance of trade. That is, the Americans buy more in total value of products from Canada than we buy from the United States.
- CARTER:	If Trump does move ahead with tariffs, the sources say the Trudeau government is ready to respond with a first round of retaliatory measures worth about 37 billion. A second round of tariffs, if needed, is reportedly worth 110 billion. Liberal leadership candidate, Chrystia Freeland, wants to take that one step further. She has suggested the Fed should cancel any contracts with American suppliers if Trump does introduce tariffs. Let's go back to Mark McAlister now. And Mark, the Ford government obviously feeling the heat around those tariff threats coming from the White House.
	Most definitely. And there wouldn't be an election coming if the unions didn't get involved either. Labor groups coming together this morning saying the focus at this point for the Ford government should be on workers and not necessarily on those U.S. tariff threats. Hundreds Rally in Toronto to Demand Nurse Staffing Ratios as Ontario Nurses' Association Bargains with Hospital CEOs

TORONTO, ON, January 29, 2025 – Hundreds of registered nurses (RNs), health-care professionals, labour leaders and allies held a large rally in Toronto today to call on hospital CEOs to implement RN-to-patient staffing ratios in Ontario's public hospitals.

The demonstration happened outside the Hilton Toronto Hotel as mediation talks took place inside between the Ontario Nurses' Association (ONA) and the Ontario Hospital Association (OHA) to determine a new contract for approximately 60,000+ RNs and health-care professionals working in public hospitals.

"ONA's front-line members have made it clear that their top priority is improving access to high-quality, safe patient care for everyone, by implementing nursing ratios now," says ONA Provincial President Erin Ariss, RN. "Ontario's hospital CEOs must invest in nursing ratios, instead of understaffing our public system and outsourcing public health-care services to private clinics."

Nurse staffing ratios are being put in place in jurisdictions in Canada, the U.S. and elsewhere to ensure there are enough RNs to provide safe, quality patient care. RN-to-patient staffing ratios have been shown to increase access to timely care and improve patient health outcomes.

"Not only will nurse staffing ratios improve the quality of care, but they will also mean fewer emergency department closures, especially in smaller communities," Ariss notes. "Guaranteeing RN staffing levels will help stem the tide of nurses leaving our public hospitals, frustrated by their inability to provide the care patients need because of understaffing.

"The brutal truth is that hospital CEOs are intentionally understaffing our public hospitals, so they can expand private care," Ariss says. "Understaffing and private health care will cost Ontarians, and that's why we are fighting back."

Mediation ends with no deal for 60,000 Ontario hospital nurses as Ontario Hospital Association opposes safe staffing

TORONTO, ON, January 31, 2025 – Following more than a week of bargaining talks and two days of mediation, the Ontario Nurses' Association (ONA) says that no negotiated contract has been reached with the Ontario Hospital Association (OHA) for the province's approximately 60,000+ hospital-sector registered nurses (RNs). In April, the matter will go to arbitration – as it has every round of negotiations for the last 14 years.

ONA Provincial President Erin Ariss, RN is expressing frustration and anger at the failure of the OHA to reach a negotiated settlement. "It's no surprise contract talks with the OHA were once again unsuccessful – negotiating with the OHA is like Groundhog Day," says Ariss. "The OHA tabled regressive, concessionary proposals. They opposed our demand for safe staffing by introducing nursing ratios. A deal cannot be achieved when those on the other side of the table are so completely disrespectful."

Ariss is particularly outraged at "employers that clearly don't have any regard for the workforce that holds our hospitals together. To sit through 'negotiations' with a group that insults our elected members is appalling. Nurses will not continue to tolerate this and I am so proud to see our members fighting back."

ONA members are seeking RN-to-patient ratios in Ontario hospitals. Nursing ratios have put in place in places like British Columbia, California and multiple other jurisdictions. Evidence shows ratios improve patient health outcomes, nursing health and safety and staffing – a great step to addressing Ontario's severe nursing shortage.

"As we prepare for arbitration, nurses will be taking collective action across the province," says Ariss. "Ontarians need to know about of the state of our health care and the failure of Doug Ford and his hospital CEO friends, who have shown they are unwilling to do what it takes to improve our public hospital care for everyone's sake."
